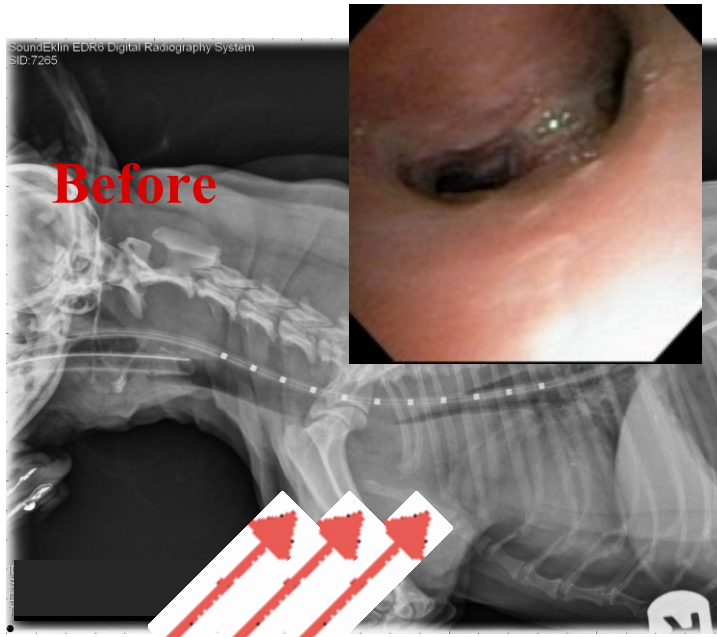


Tracheal Stenting



- Tracheal collapse is a progressive, degenerative disease of the cartilage rings which leads to collapse during respiration.
- Primarily for moderate to severe tracheal collapse with poor response to medical management.
- Restores good quality of life to pets exhibiting severe exercise intolerance and generally decreases long-term medication requirements.
- Over 90% of the patients have significant improvement of their respiratory function, with most showing marked improvement for years.
- Earlier reports of higher risks of fracture and migration were associated with inappropriately sized implants. Recent changes in stent sizing and design have greatly decreased these complications.
- Heart disease and other systemic conditions will negatively impact prognosis.
